Our challenge is to see to it that after discontinuation of support the local population is in a position to continue the projects at their own initiative and to shape their lives in an independent and responsible manner.

Economic development is a basic prerequisite for the lasting reduction of poverty and therefore an essential foundation for sustainable development. Hilfswerk Austria wants to help strengthen economic development and develop modern economic structures in its partner countries. It is important to us to incorporate Austrian and European companies into our projects and to support the business initiatives of companies committed to social and ecological values through confidence-building measures. Furthermore, we support companies in the implementation of CSR (corporate social responsibility) initiatives and welcome the voluntary assumption of social responsibility by companies as a step toward establishing the necessary basic conditions throughout the world.



Hilfswerk Austria International provides worldwide disaster relief in the aftermath of wars and natural disasters as well as competent project management in long-term development projects and programmes. Abstract from Activity Report 2010

In 2010 HWA has carried out more than 70 projects in 29 countries. Our team counts 87 employees, where 68 of them are local staff in project countries worldwide.

In 2010, Hilfswerk Austria International's total expenditure amounted to 10.022.650 Euro. 9.431.584 Eur (94%) directly benefited the projects, 2,2% were used for fundraising / public relations and 3,7% for administration. The projects were funded by the Austrian Development Cooperation (7,4%), the European Union (16%), other national and international donors/ popartners (43,5%) and own resources including private donations (33,1%).

HWA strategy in B&H in the period 2008 - 2012:

Balkan countries and in particular Bosnia and Herzegovina have been in the focus of Hilfswerk Austria activities as of 1992. HWA has gained the specific expertness and experience in B&H in the field of minority reintegration, refugees and DPs support, job creation, social inclusion, social housing, agriculture, income generation, employment and socio-economic development, support to small enterprises, democratization, local capacity building in the period 1996 – 2011.

Thanks to engagement of motivated and educated local staff HWA has established and developed the Balkan Central Mission in Sarajevo in 1996. The B&H Mission has initiated and supported regional development through the HWA Missions in Croatia and Serbia. Expert and experienced staff from the Mission B&H was engaged for internal monitoring and supervision of other Balkan



missions and projects. Procedures and documents developed in B&H Mission were standardized and used in all HWA Missions worldwide.

HWA is planning to continue the presence and the Mission in B&H as long as the need for assistance exists, in the scope of the strategy. The B&H mission will be further developed and staff trained and educated for interventions in the wider region of Balkans.

HWA has strong and respectable references in Bosnia and Herzegovina with various donors (international and local): Austrian, US and Dutch governments, EC, UNHCR, other Austrian donors, B&H government of all levels, in management and implementation of 73 projects valued more than **52 Million Euro**. More than 3.500 houses have been reconstructed, 5.414 grants delivered, at least 60 permanent jobs created, and from which some 26,4 Million Euro and 1.860 houses only in partnership with EC. Through years, HWA has diversified activities in the country toward the poverty reduction, social inclusion, socio-economic development and support to the most vulnerable groups.

The gained knowledge in B&H reflects particularly in the following fields:

- Proper selection of the beneficiaries; Continuous work with beneficiaries, particularly with minorities and support on reintegration in their pre-war environment in the course of complete project implementation; Reconstruction of houses including all categories of damages from minor ones to total damage; Social housing; Social inclusion of disabled, minorities, war victims; Reconstruction of technical infrastructure, water, electricity, roads, bridges, whereby the sustainability of return is being provided; Reconstruction and equipping of social infrastructure: schools, first-aid stations, homes for the elderly etc.;
- Expert knowledge and carrying out of tender procedure in compliance with international regulations even since 1997 in particular EU procurement procedures;
- Job creation within agriculture field and in small workshops for returned persons (equipment procurement for small crafts start, providing new trade knowledge etc.) as well as advicerendering services and directing to possible job sources;
- Legal services rendering and advising by our local (and international) lawyers having longstanding experience concerning the rights of the returned persons and their housing issues;
- Local capacity building through close cooperation on the project preparation and implementation with local authorities and establishment of several local associations (NGOs) of different profiles;

The HWA B&H country strategy is based on the strategies and plans for Bosnia and Herzegovina by the main HWA partners-donors: EC B&H Country Strategy Paper; Austrian Cooperation with Eastern Europe – Country program for B&H; Netherlands Programme - Strategic Issues 2005 – 2008 for B&H: UNHCR B&H program; Strategy for implementation of Dayton Peace Agreement (DPA) Annex 7 by the B&H Ministry for Human Rights and Refugees (MHRR)

Strategic Goals and activities:

- 1. Diversification of activities in accordance to the country development strategies and projects in the field of democracy and human rights, ecology, local capacity building, infrastructure, socioeconomical development, social housing, sustainable support and social inclusion and care (family-children).
 - The expansion of possibilities and activities on country development projects is already visible. The process of B&H stabilization and association (SAP) is going to be very intensive and consequently the international support to B&H will be focused on the country development.
- 2. Contribution to Roma Decade 2005-2015 through provision of housing to Roma population.
- 3. Continuation and strengthening of the cooperation with local authorities all levels from the municipality to the state level. Continuation of work on the common projects.
- 4. Continuation of the implementation of the DPA Annex 7 in the field of reconstruction and sustainable refugee return till 2014.



In accordance to the new re-registration of refugees ended on March 31, 2005, revised Strategy of Annex VII DPA implementation and Ministry of human rights and refugees B&H (MHRR) Strategy it is expected that the process of minority refugee return will be finalized latest till the end of 2014 when this issue will be closed;

- 5. Introduction of social-inclusion and social-care projects focused on family-children, youth, old-people, vulnerable and handicapped in close cooperation with Österreichisches Hilfswerk. Transfer of valuable knowledge from Austria, education and training of local experts.
- 6. Strengthening the role of the Mission B&H as Mission Balkan and widening of HWA activities to regional development projects in particular economical development and ecology-infrastructure and education (research projects with expert EU and B&H partners).
- 7. Maintaining the partnership relations with the main donors / partners US government, EC, UNHCR, Austrian Embassy, Dutch Embassy, BiH government, and initiating partnership and cooperation with other bilateral donors.
- 8. Creation of an affiliated B&H organization (HAJDE) and establishing the info-pull and the basis for the network of local associations devoted to the social welfare.
